The Maximum Drawbar Height will be 16" in Class A and 18" in Classes B, C, D, E, F and G.

Maximum Tire Sizes:

Class A, B 13.6 x 38

Class C, D, E ... 15.5 x 38

Class F, G ...Unlimited

NO CUT TIRES PERMITTED

The track will be 250 feet in length.

Additional Rules for Antiques:

- 1 Each tractor may be entered in no more than two classes, but only once in each class.
- 2 In case of a tie, the winner must participate in a pull-off or they will be disqualified.
- 3 Engine's RPMs must be within 10% of factory rated engine RPM. **THEY WILL BE CHECKED.**
- 4 Tractors in classes A thru E must be equipped with original rear wheels and centers. After market or modified press steel wheels or clamp on dual wheels will not be permitted in these classes.
- 5 No turbochargers will be permitted in any classes.
- 6 Stock tractors must have original carburetor, engine block, cylinder head and P.T.O. shaft if so equipped from the factory.
- 7 Weights must be securely fastened.
- 8 All tractors eligible for the contest will be 1960 and older.
- 9 Classes A thru E - Pull in low gear (1st gear, low range) Classes F thru G - Your choice
- 10 Judges Decision is final. Any arguing with officials will be cause for disqualification.
- 11 Use of Torque Amplifier will be permitted.

LARGE TRACTORS

**SAFETY REGULATIONS AND RULES
ELIGIBILITY OF TRACTOR**

- 1 In case of a tie, the winner must participate in a pull-off or they will be disqualified.
- 2 Contests open to farm tractors with rubber tires. No four wheel drives allowed. No dual tires, tire studs, or chains permitted.
- 3 Each tractor may be entered in more than one class, but only once in each class.
- 4 Minimum drawbar length will be 18" from center of rear axle to point of hook. Draw bars stationary, maximum of 20" from top of hitch, parallel to ground in all classes.
- 5 Drawbars must be equipped with a hitching device not more than 1" in thickness and must have a 3" diameter opening. Pulling point may not be more than 1.5" from back edge of the hitching device.
- 6 No pressurized tanks allowed except LP gas, no oxygen or nitrous allowed.
- 7 All engine radiators must be properly shrouded. Not over 20" wide tires are eligible.
- 8 All exhausts must discharge upward above the highest point of tractor and be securely attached. Rain caps may not be used.
- 9 No portion of the tractor shall interfere with the sled hitch during a pull.
- 10 All weights must be safely secured to the tractor.
- 11 Position or location of weights cannot be changed after the tractor has been hooked to the pulling machine.
- 12 All tractors with Turbos or Blowers or turning more than stock RPMs must have approved kill switches. Rice and cane tires are prohibited.
- 13 Engine RPMs must be within 10% of factory rated engine RPM.
- 14 Blowers or turbo chargers are permitted.

OPERATION OF CONTEST

- 1 Officials may run any combination of classes.
- 2 All sanctioned tractor pulls must use an authorized weight transfer device.
- 3 The use of torque converters, automatic shifts, etc. will be permitted during the pull.
- 4 Operators must remain seated during the pull, and must have complete control of the tractor at all times or be disqualified.
- 5 All pulls must be started from a tight hitch -- no jerking will be permitted.
- 6 Tractors must be stopped immediately upon signal from judge.
- 7 Tractors must be operated in a safe manner at all times.
- 8 Tractors and skid must remain within boundaries of the contest course during the pull or entrant will be disqualified.
- 9 Only one pull allowed each contestant unless tie is declared.
- 10 The pull shall be considered over when forward motion of the load stops. No restart once a pull is started. The judge shall hold hole-digging to a minimum.
- 11 Any consumption of alcoholic beverages will be grounds for disqualification.

GENERAL RULES FOR TRACTOR PULLS

- 1 Violations of any rules shall constitute a disqualification.
- 2 Contest to be governed by judge or judges will all decisions final.
- 3 Judges have the right to stop and disqualify any tractor if it is not being operated in such a manner as would be considered safe.

SAFETY PRACTICES TO BE ENFORCED

Remember, almost anything goes, but keep in mind the safety of the crowd and yourself when building and operating your machine. All tractors equipped with PTO should have shelf in place. Only the operator will be permitted on any tractor. Refuel only engines that have cooled. No sharp turns, excessive speed, or other acts deemed to be unsafe. Any arguments between participants will disqualify those participants.
